3. Glen Allan Parent Survey Results

- The results are now available for the 2021-22 EIPS Parent Survey conducted in March. Thank you to all families who took the time to share their feedback with the Division. <u>Parent Survey Results: Division</u>
- The overall Division results represent 3,450 responses from parents and guardians across the Division. Just under 100 parents responded from Glen Allan
- The survey results for Glen Allan have helped us identify the following areas of strength and opportunities for growth.
 - Areas of strength:
 - Overall, approximately 85% of parents were either satisfied or strongly satisfied in all areas of the school

- Parents know their children are cared for and encouraged to do their best with 92% and 94.5% of parents responding with satisfaction respectively
- Over 90% of parents responded that students are safe and demonstrate positive citizenship at Glen Allan
- Opportunities for growth:
 - Quality of Education fewer parents agree that quality of school has increased this year and the satisfaction with the quality of education, teaching, and leadership went down slightly, from an average of 95% to 87%
 - Overall satisfaction the percentage of parents who are dissatisfied across all questions increased by about 5%
- The feedback gathered in the survey will help our school and the Division measure its progress toward meeting the priorities and goals outlined in the EIPS <u>Four-Year</u>
 <u>Education Plan</u> and develop strategies to better serve students and the wider community moving forward.

 - As the survey results also indicate, Glen Allan Elementary is genuinely concerned for the welfare and success of your children.

 - Our teams have the opportunity to see how your child interacts with others while at school and they use their collective professional judgment in determining how to place your child in a group that they feel will best benefit their growth. Classroom placements are the result of many conversations between all of the teachers in a grade level, our counsellor and the administration team.
 - We ask for your support in allowing teachers to develop next year's grouping in the fairest way possible.
