3. Playground – Amber

 also a Community Fundraising Enhancement Program grant for \$25,000 is available to apply for

8. Fundraising Jenn Campbell

- Online Readathon platform ideas for May:
 using an online company and it takes 20%. Teachers would need to log it daily and everyone signs
 up for an app and log it in the evening from home as well. Would require a US Paypal account.
 Parents will have to pledge online through the app
- Specific fundraiser for the library through EIPS and you access through Power School for donations, but that works as a direct fundraiser for the school not GASC
- Alternatively, we could use the Hot Lunch site has lower transaction fees
- Prizes: can go from simple education to other schools having Nintendo Switch or Gift Cards.
- Could add say for a classroom with the most participation also get an extra 15 minutes of recess or the principal dresses up in a silly costume.
