# **Administrator's Report**

- 1. Thank you GASC for a wonderful year at Glen Allan
  - Special thanks to Christy, Sheila and Cynthia for the time they've given as parent council executive this year.

## 2. Glen Allan Parent Survey Results

- Firstly, thank you to the families who completed the principal evaluation survey supports my 2-year evaluation – self-reflection and formal presentation to the EIPS Executive team that I did yesterday.
- The results for the 2022-23 EIPS Parent Survey conducted in March will soon be posted to our school website. Thank you to all families who took the time to share their feedback with the Division.
- There were 80 parents responded from Glen Allan, slightly lower than last year but still a good representation – 25% of school population
- The survey results for Glen Allan have helped us identify the following areas of strength and opportunities for growth.
  - Areas of strength:
    - Overall, almost 90% of parents were either satisfied or strongly satisfied in all areas of the school
    - Parents know their children are cared for and encouraged to do their best with 97% of parents responding with satisfaction to both of these questions
    - Over 95% of parents responded that students are safe and demonstrate positive citizenship at Glen Allan
    - Academically, over 95% of parents responded with satisfaction with the quality of teaching and the growth they've seen in their child's literacy and numeracy skills
    - Caregivers also expressed satisfaction in opportunities to be involved in and informed about our school with over 90% responding positively to that group of questions. An area of growth was specifically related to opportunities to be involved with 92% of parents being satisfied compared the 78% last year.

  - SEP Goal 3: By working collaboratively to foster a positive school culture of collective responsibility, more students will engage in respectful interactions and model active citizenship as measured by the Alberta Education Assurance Survey and EIPS Engagement Surveys.

- Aside from academic needs, we also take into consideration how to balance social, emotional and behavioural needs in each group.
- Our teams have the opportunity to see how your child interacts with others while at school and they use their collective professional judgment in determining how to place your child in a group that they feel will best benefit their growth. Classroom placements are the result of many conversations between all of the teachers in a grade level, our counsellor and the administration team.
